

ORDINANCE NO. 110

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF HOKAH, HOUSTON COUNTY, MINNESOTA  
REGULATING THE RECDREATIONAL AND OTHER PUBLIC PROPERTIES OIN  
THE CITY OF HOKAH, AND PROVIDING PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATIN  
THEREOF.

The City Council of the City of Hokah, Houston County, Minnesota, hereby  
ordains as follows:

SECTION I. INTENT. The purpose for the enactment of this ordinance is to  
assure the protection and effective maintenance of the public properties of the City of  
Hokah, and to assure the safety of all persons having occasion to legitimately enter in and  
upon the said properties.

SECTION II. SCOPE. The provisions hereof apply to the Municipal Swimming  
Pool, the parks and playgrounds, and the area in and about Como Falls-Thompson Creek.

SECTION III. CERTAIN ACTS DEEMED TO BE TRESPASS. A) Any person  
who enters the enclosure surrounding the municipal swimming pool at a time other than  
when the pool facility is open for use and is adequately staffed by regular guards and  
other such employees, unless the person be a member of the Maintenance Department or  
of the pool management team or other authorized person on the premises for purposes of  
maintaining the same, making repairs or inspections thereon, shall be deemed a  
trespasser, but in any event any unauthorized person entering the swimming pool facility  
or grounds after the hour of 7:30 o'clock P.M. shall be deemed a trespasser.

b) Any person who shall enter the premises of a municipal park or playground or  
Como Falls –Thompson Creek area between the hours of 9:00 o'clock P.M. and sunrise  
the following day, unless he be found on a public street or thoroughfare therein, shall be  
deemed a trespasser, except in cases where his presence therein is by virtue of an existing  
emergency, or he is an enforcement officer in the pursuit of his duties.

SECTION IV. VIOLATIONS. Persons violating the provisions of this ordinance  
shall, upon conviction thereof, be adjudged guilty of a petty misdemeanor, and shall be  
punished in the manner provided by the laws of the State of Minnesota for petty  
misdemeanors.

SECTION V. REPEALER. The provisions of any ordinance of the City of  
Hokah which are inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION VI. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall be effective upon its  
due passage and enactment and publication according to law.
