

ORDINANCE NO 28: An Ordinance regulating horses and cattle running at large.
The president and trustees of the village of Hokah do ordain as follows.

SECTION 1.

That between the 1st day of Nov. and the 15th day of June it shall be unlawful for cattle, mule or horses to run at large within the corporate limits of said village and it shall be the duty of the village Marshall pound master or any other person to take up or cause to be taken up all animals of the cattle mule or horse kind, age, or description which may be found running at large within the corporate limits of the village.

SECTION 2.

The owner of any animal of the cattle mule or horse kind impounded for violating Sec. 1 of this ordinance shall pay the village Marshal or Pound Master one dollar for each and every animal above mentioned and fifty cents per day for every additional day or part of day until they are taken out.
