

ORDINANCE NO 68

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO 60 ENTITLED
AN ORDINANCE TO PROTECT THE PUBLIC HEALTH AND
SAFETY BY DEFINING, LICENSING AND REGULATING
TRAILER HOUSES AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR
VIOLATION THEREOF

The Village Council of the Village of Hokah, Minnesota, ordains that Section 2 of Ordinance No. 60 entitled "An Ordinance to Protect the Public Health and Safety by defining, licensing and regulating trailer houses and providing a penalty for Violation thereof" is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 2. Use of trailer houses for permanent abode prohibited. No owner shall be permitted to use a trailer house for a permanent dwelling or place of abode in the Village of Hokah, Minnesota, for indefinite periods of time unless such trailer house is located at a trailer camp duly Licensed by the Village Council of the Village of Hokah and in accordance with applicable laws of the State of Minnesota, or unless situate in or upon lands on the said Village of Hokah lying and being between the easterly right of way line of Minnesota Truck Highway 16-44 and westerly of the westerly right of way line of Houston County State Aid Highway No. 7. House trailers used for housing purposes in Hokah, Minnesota, regular or at intervals over a period of more than two (2) weeks shall be conclusively presumed to be used for permanent dwelling or place of abode within the meaning of this ordinance.

And that the provisions of this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after June 11, 1969.
